

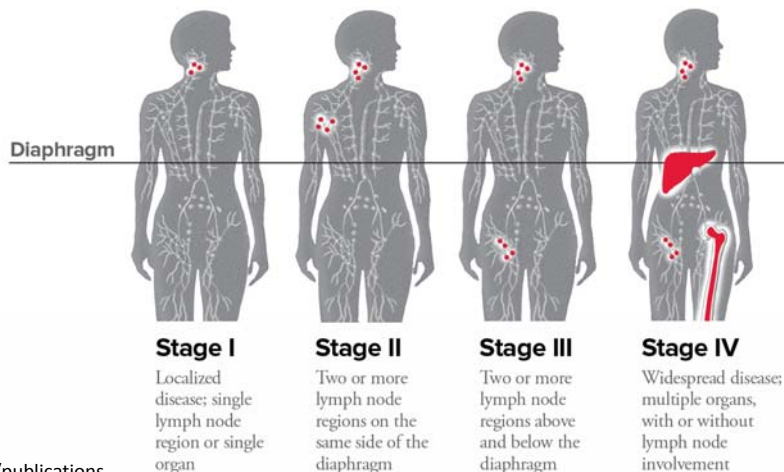
Advances in Blood Cancers: NHL Treatment and Survivorship

Getting a Second Opinion

- It is important to confirm a specific cancer diagnosis
- Request that your doctor send your records to the oncologist who'll be providing the second opinion
- Have your test results reviewed by a pathologist who specializes in hematology-oncology
- It's okay to let your doctor know that you'd like a second opinion

- Staging helps define where the disease is in the body

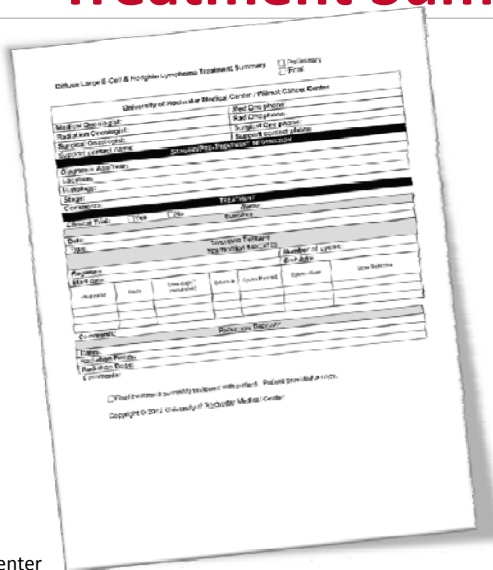
NHL Staging

- Staging determined by testing
 - PET/CT scans
 - Blood tests
 - Physical exam
- Staging helps determine choice of treatment
